Why Synthetic Phonics

Traditionally, Analytic phonics has been a common method used to teach children how to read on a word level, instead of getting them to blend words together on a sound (phoneme) level. In other words, children learn how to analyse a word by taking clues from the entire word, initial sound, as well as the context. Hence, Analytic phonics adopts a hit and miss approach which encourages guessing as a first reading strategy!

Conversely, Synthetic phonics is a method that is easy to pick up and eliminates the need for guessing. Students are taught small groups of letter sounds so they can begin blending when reading and segmenting letter sounds in words when spelling. This method involves synthesising, or blending of phonemes to make a word, enabling the child to start off on the right foot.

Synthetic Phonics vs Analytic Phonics

Synthetic Phonics

Each phoneme in a word is just as important.

This effectively eliminates the need for guessing because this technique focuses on the initial, medial and final sounds of a word

Focuses on coding and decoding a word, hence allowing children to learn spelling at the same time!

Example: After learning the letters and sounds to S, T, O and P, students will be able to blend these letters to read words such as stop, top, and pot!

Since it is important to emphasise on every letter in the word when they are blending the sound, students will essentially be learning their spelling at the same time!

Analytic Phonics

Only emphasizes on the first letter of the word. For instance, the letter 's' for the word 'sun'.

This makes it challenging for children to learn longer words. Students often have to resort to auessina.

Spelling is learnt separately slowing down their learning progress.

Example: When learning the letter P, students will typically be taught words starting with the same letter. For instance: put, pia pen and plau.

They are then taught to read and memorise the entire word simply noting that each word begins with the same sound that is associated with the letter P.

The Importance of Learning Phonics

Phonics is a great way to set your child on the right footing when they first learn how to read!

For a child who does not know how to read, words can appear like a confusing piece of abstract art. Phonics prepares your child to read by teaching them how they can link the sounds they know to letters and words. In other words, this method works like a pair of reading glasses, helping children to "see" these words clearly and understand them better!


Phonetic Sequence
